



1.0 INTRODUCTION

A full-fledged School of Distance Learning and Continuing Education of Kakatiya University came into existence in 1988 dedicating itself towards removing all barriers that traditionally restrict access to University level studies while offering a number of correspondence-cum-contact courses, non-formal education and certain other non-conventional courses. The basic task of the School is to provide equality of educational sources for all adult Indians in general and residents of North Telangana districts in particular regardless of their prior academic credential. Thus, the school focuses its attention mainly to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge by different means, which are generally not observed in formal education. In the process, the School has scheduled its programmes with an aim of covering larger segments of population vocations and professions and maintenance of a high quality of teaching, training, counselling and guidance.

The School of Distance, Learning and Continuing Education (SDLCE) provides access to higher education, especially to all those who desire to improve their formal qualifications, skills and competence in a specified field of subject. Most of these could be achieved because, the School generally:

- adopts an open admission policy;
- * facilitates the students to pace and undertake his/her studies as per his/her choice;
- * develops techniques and methods of delivery systems for students to minimize constraints of money, time and place of specific groups;
- * designs programmes to meet the needs of specific groups and areas;
- * provides after-guidance services to promote continuing education, and
- * enters into collaboration with other concerned organisations and institutions and share experience which will mutually benefit each other.

1.1 THE SUPPORT SERVICES

- **1.1.1 Course Material:** The Course Material is designed in such a manner that it will provide the students a general understanding of the subject matter and also gives guidance for further reading on the subject. The material covers about 90% of the syllabus. However, the students are also advised to refer the suggested readings for elaborate description of the subject. The Course Material includes syllabus, model question paper and some suggested readings for the benefit of the students.
- **1.1.2 Mode of Instruction:** The teaching methods used include formal counselling and discussions. In addition to classroom activities, video programmes will be organised separately as a part of learning process. Throughout the course, the learners are encouraged and are given opportunity of getting involved in the course work in order to bring greater effectiveness of the teaching-cum-learning process.
- 1.1.3 Personal Contact Programme (PCP): The Personal Contact Programme has been designed to , help the learners with classroom counselling to cover the important & difficult topics of the course. The students shall bear in mind that PCP shall not cover the entire syllabi of the course and only the major topics shall be covered. These Programmes are also intended to provide adequate provision to discuss the individual difficulties among the

students relating to their, subjects with the respective counsellors. The School adopts the counselling of the course syllabus through two sessions firstly with "Contact Programmes" being conducted on Sundays/holidays and finally with the "Regular Contact Programme" for a short period. The schedule of the programme of these two sessions of the complete course will be communicated in advance covering all the details. However, if there are any alterations during the later stage the revised time-table will be communicated. Under such circumstances the students should bear the inconvenience, if caused any.

- 1.1.4 Faculty for Counselling: All the concerned departments of the University are mainly involved as the faculty members for counselling the course syllabi. The services of qualified & experienced faculty members of the University and the affiliated colleges who teach simultaneously for the regular stream are utilised to impart the theoretical and practical knowledge of academic discipline related to their respective courses. They shall also guide the students in the regional languages wherever found necessary and convenient to them. As self learning process, the learners are advised to come prepared to the class with some basic knowledge of the concerned topic so that the guidance given by the counsellor would enrich their subject knowledge and also enable them to go for further intensive reading.
- **1.1.5** Examination Orientation Session: During the last phase of the Regular Contact Programme, one class will exclusively be allotted to discuss the issues concerned with the Examinations from the learner's point of view. A set of old question papers which will be provided to the students during this session will be taken up for discussion. This session will benefit the students to acquire knowledge as to how to attempt the answers and the methodology to be adopted to prepare for the examinations.
- **1.1.6 Guest Lectures:** To give wider exposure to our learners, the School engages some guest lectures during the personal contact programme with the involvement of eminent scholars, professionals and members of other Universities. These lectures will enlighten the students on the current developments in specific topics and give an opportunity to interact with the guest speakers.
- **1.1.7 Enquiries**: The students are required to go through the Information Brochure carefully to get themselves acquainted with the rules and regulations and other provisions. However any doubt, clarification or any other necessary information can be obtained at our "Enquiry Counter" during the office hours.
- **1.1.8 Student Correspondence Services**: The School has a separate Correspondence and Grievance Cell to receive the letters and reply the queries posed by the existing and prospective students relating to various problems faced by them in the process of prosecuting their studies through the School.
- 1.1.9 Doora Vidyavani (AIR Warangal): The students can clarify their academic doubts while addressing a letter to the Director, AIR Warangal, which is broadcasting on 1st Saturday of every month.

2.0 ACADEMIC RULES AND INFORMATION

The Certificates, Under Graduation, Diploma, PG Diploma, Post-Graduation Degrees shall be conferred to candidates who have satisfied the General Conditions under the Academic-Rules and Regulations as specified hereunder. The candidates are required to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations that are in force and those that will come into effect from time to time as formulated by the University or by the School. The University or the School shall in future include any item not covered in the rules and regulations as they deem fit and proper and the decision taken shall be final and binding.

- 2.1 Course and Syllabus: The admission to various courses is based on the conditions as laid down in the provisions of "Eligibility for Admission". There will be no entrance test for admission unless and otherwise specified into Certificate/Under Graduation (through Intermediate qualification), Diploma, P.G. Diploma and PG Courses. The School follows the Syllabus approved by the University.
- **2.2 Change of Syllabus:** If there is a change in the scheme of examination or syllabus one more examination will be conducted as per the old scheme or old syllabus. There after candidates who have not completed the course, have to appear for the examinations as per the revised scheme or syllabi.
- 2.3 Simultaneous Admission: No candidate shall be allowed to take admission simultaneously or appear at two different examinations simultaneously conducted by this University or any other university. Violation of this rule will entail cancellation of admission as per the University rules. However, this will not be applicable to those candidates who wish to join computer courses offered by the school. However, according to DEC orders, a candidate permitted to do one Degree & one Diploma or Certificate course simultaneously.
- **2.4 Term of Registration:** Candidates admitted into Post-Graduate Two years courses shall complete their course within 6 (six) years and the candidates admitted into P.G. Diploma (One year) course shall complete their course within 3 (three) years from the date of admission failing which their admission stands cancelled. Such candidates shall seek fresh admission again.
- 2.5 Change of Course/Subject: If a candidate wishes to transfer, from one PG course to another due to his inability he may be allowed to do so provided he fulfills the eligibility conditions of the admission of the desired course. Request for application of the desired course should be made within a month from the date of confirmation of the admission into the applied course. Candidates' application will be examined and if found eligible will be permitted for transfer. Such candidates are required to pay Rs. 400/- towards the registration fee in view of the transfer.
- 2.6 Change of Study Centre: If a candidate wishes to be transferred from one study centre to another, request application should be made within a month from the date of confirmation of his/her admission. Candidates' application will be examined and if found eligible will be permitted for transfer. Such candidates are required to pay Rs. 500/towards transfer fee.

2.7 Re-Admission: The candidates who discontinued or who are default of payment of tuition fee during an academic year can seek re-admission by submitting the application in the prescribed proforma and on payment of **Rs. 530/-** towards Re-admission.

2.8 Transfer Certificate

- If a student wishes to discontinue the study in the School after paying the fee in full and applies in writing for TC within 5 days he/she will be issued without any payment. In other cases **Rs. 100/-** will be levied towards the fee for TC.
- The original TC submitted at the time of admission in the School shall not be returned. The school shall issue a fresh TC after the completion of the entire course (the last day of examination) of study or if the candidate discontinues in the middle of the study period after paying the fee in full. The candidates who took the TC and discontinued their study are not permitted to appear for the examinations for the same academic year.
- Duplicate TC will be issued on payment of Rs. **400/-** subject to the production of a Certificate issued by the 1st Class Magistrate and a letter from the concerned Police Station to the effect that the original was lost. After careful scrutiny, the candidate will be issued a duplicate TC depending on the merits of the case.
- The Award of Division, issue of Provisional, Memo of Marks and Convocation formalities and all other matters relating to the examinations shall be looked after by the Controller of Examinations and governed by the rules and regulations in vogue.
- **2.9 Pending Dues**: If the candidate satisfies the academic requirements but has not paid the dues or not submitted the required documents to the School within the stipulated period of time or if any case of indiscipline is pending against him, the decision of the University/School to this effect will be final and binding.

2.10 Maintenance of Discipline

- The School shall have complete power for maintaining discipline among the students of the School. The School may frame any rule or rules from time to time to enforce discipline.
- Every student applying for admission should sign a declaration pledging adherence to the rules and regulations of the University/School.
- The behaviour of the students with the teaching staff, office and other employees of the School should be polite and courteous.
- The Director will ordinarily communicate whenever necessary with the employer or parents of each of the students whose conduct is not satisfactory.
- The students found incorrigible even after warnings may be removed from the rolls on intimation. The decision of the Director in this matter shall be final and binding.

2.11 Students Address

- All Correspondence made to the students will be to the address as mentioned in the application form.
- If there is any change in the address, six slips have to be sent to the School along with a covering letter.

Any change of Address of a student should be intimated at least 15 days in advance to ensure prompt correspondence from the School. Frequent changes of address cannot be entertained unless the period of stay at one place as per the change of address is for a period of 6 months. If the period is less than that, they have to make their own arrangement for redirecting their correspondence to the correct address.

- **2.12 Acknowledgement:** Students are advised to preserve the acknowledgements /receipts issued by the School for receipt of fees or certificates and also other correspondence till the degree certificate is issued to them finally. The identity cards and hall-tickets should also be preserved for any verification by the School authorities during the course period.
- 2.13 Special Attention of the Students: Distance Education courses are offered by the University for the benefit of those who intend to persue higher studies and could not join the regular colleges due to various reasons. In view of the limitations of the special mode of education, the students should keep in touch with the SDLCE and acquaint themselves WITH THE ACADEMIC SCHEDULES, EXAMINATIONS, RESULTS, etc. The SDLCE on its part would however take the responsibility to inform the students through correspondence, News Papers/Radio announcements or SMS, etc., but in case the student concerned fail to receive any of the communication from any of the source, they are advised to persue the matter without waiting for the communication. They may contact the office as per the general schedule given. This is very important from the point of view of gaining maximum advantage of the services offered by the SDLCE for the benefit of students. 2.14 General Rules of admission

- Admission into UG/PG/PG Diploma/Certificate Diploma Programmes is open to all the citizens of India.
- No gap of time is necessary for registering for the various courses after passing the qualifying examination.
- There is no age limit restrictions for registration into any PG/PG Diploma Certificate Programme.
- The admission into PG/PG Diploma Programme is not based on entrance examination. (Wherever seats are unlimited)
- Admission of students for any course who were qualified from other Universities/ Bodies will be considered only on the condition if their qualifications are recognised by Kakatiya University.

- In service Candidates working in any institutions i.e., State/Central/Quasi or any Private organisation can also apply for admission into UG/PG/PG Diploma Courses.
- **2.15** Equivalence Certificate: The candidates obtained their Degree from other than AP Universities are required to get Equivalency Certificate, if they are not approved by KU before seeking admission failing which no admission shall be given under any circumstances.

The following is the procedure for applying and getting equivalency Certificate from this University for the qualifying examinations obtained from other than AP Universities.

- 1. The University must have been recoginsed by UGC
- 2. The Distance Education Programmes must be recognized by the DEC.
- 3. The Distance Education programmes offered by the Deemed Universities need not be recognised (as per the UGC guidelines)

After observing the above conditions, the qualifying examinations of the candidates along with the following enclosures have to be referred to the Registrar, Academic, Kakatiya University for further action.

- 1. Application of the candidate and the xerox copy of the qualifying examinations
- 2. The syllabus and scheme of the examinations duly signed by the concerned authority / University
- 3. A processing fee of **Rs. 1,000/-** paid either in "C" Challan of this University or Demand Draft drawn in favour of Registrar, KU Income Account, Kakatiya University, payable at State Bank of Hyderabad, KU Branch, Warangal.

2.16 Mode of Payment:

- Student seeking admission should submit the application form accompanying fee. Payment should be made through SDLCE challan Payable at SDLCE SBH challan counter.

OR

- Through a single crossed Demand Draft drawn from SBH/ SBI / Andhra Bank in favour of the Director, SDLCE, Kakatiya University payable at Warangal.
- The name, address and subject should be written by the candidates on the reverse side of the DD to ensure proper credit to their fee account.
- Postal Orders/ M.O/s or any other mode of payment will not be accepted. The school will not be held responsible for such payments.
- Students claiming fee concession will have to submit a concession form which will be provided to them at the time of fee payment. The declaration (Unemployee) should be attested by a Gazetted Officer.
- Incase of University Employees/University Employee's Children/Employee spouse, the concerned employee is required to submit the service certificate issued by the

Registrar, KU in order to claim the fee concession in accordance with the rules of the University.

- Fee once paid will not be refunded nor transferred to any course nor adjusted infull of part there of for the subsequent years.
- SDLCE and its offices at the Study Centre/Regional Centre will accept only the DD's taken from State Bank of Hyderabad, State Bank of India and Andhra Bank. DD's taken from other Banks will not be accepted for our administrative reasons.

2.17 Refund of Fee

- In respect of those candidates whose applications for admission are cancelled by the school for any reason, except in the case of misconduct / or misbehaviour 10% of the tuition fee besides admission & regulation fee will be deducted from the fee paid and the balance will be refunded.
- CANDIDATES WHO SUBMIT APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWS ON HIS/HER OWN WILL NOT BE ENTITLED FOR ANY REFUND.
- **2.18** Course Material for all PG courses will be issued at a specified counter in the Main Office only. Those who submit their admission form at the Study Centre will get the material at the Study Centre.
- **2.19** Those who collect and submit the forms at Study Centre/Regional Centre Offices may have to follow specified timings of the individual offices.
- **2.20 Certificates to be submitted at the time of admission:** SSC memo, Inter memo, Degree provisional and consolidated memo Xerox copies.
- **2.21 Migration Certificate:** Candidate hails from other than Kakatiya University must submit MC.

Note: TC will be issued to the candidates who submit their TC at the time of admission.

3.0 Examination Information

3.1. Mode of Language: As far as the examinations are concerned the School gives the option to write the examinations either in English or Telugu language (except for M.Sc. Psychology. MA English, Hindi/Telugu/Urdu/MCJ/MLISc/MBA and Diploma Courses). However, the question papers may not be provided in Telugu version for all courses. The option to write in Telugu version should be treated as an additional facility permitted to the students

3.2. Award of Division

First Division with Distinction : 70% and above

First Division : Below 70% but not less than 60% Second Division : Below 60% but not less than 50% Third Division : Below 50% but not less than 40%

3.3 Paper Minimum 40%, except for courses otherwise specified

- **3.4 Promotion**: Though the candidate does not secure 40% in each paper he/she shall be promoted to Final year despite of the backlog papers. Promotion to the final year shall be subject to the condition that he/she should submit the examination form within the stipulated time and receive the hall-ticket in accordance with the instructions laid down by the school.
- **3.5 Hall Ticket & Time Table:** The hall-tickets will be issued only to those candidates whose application is found in order and is found eligible to appear for the examination. *The hall-ticket can be received only as stated below either,*
- i) One hour before the commencement of the examination at their respective exam centre,

OR

- ii) At the office of the School, three days before the commencement of examinations. Detailed time-table & examination centre will be intimated to every eligible candidate well in advance.
- **3.6. Duplicate Hall Ticket:** Candidates desirous of having duplicate Hall-ticket have to apply to the "Controller of Examination, Kakatiya University" with two pass port size photographs and fee of **Rs. 20/-.** Such duplicate hall-tickets will be issued only after ascertaining the facts that the original has been lost by the candidates.
- **3.7. Ex-Candidates:** The candidates who could not appear for the Previous Examination (Hall-tickets being issued to them) shall be permitted to appear as ex-candidates during the next academic year along with the annual examination if continued on rolls-for final year or the subsequent annual examinations if completed the final year.

The Candidates who could not write the Final year examinations (Hall-tickets being issued to them) shall be permitted to appear as ex-candidates during the next annual examinations or subsequent examinations. Such candidates are required to pay the examination fees only. Intimations will be sent to these candidates only once and not during the subsequent years. Candidates desirous to write these examinations should observe the daily Newspapers or contact the office for further details.

- **3.8 Improvement:** The candidates are permitted to improve their performance in the immediate two examinations after passing the respective examinations. Only one chance will be allowed to improve their earlier performance, the candidates are required to APPEAR FOR ALL THE PAPERS NOT ONE OR TWO PAPERS.
- **3.9 Revaluation:** The candidates who desires to apply for Revaluation should obtain the prescribed application form at the office of the Controller of Examinations, Addl. Controller of Exams, SDLCE, Kakatiya University and submit the same within the stipulated time along with the fee of **Rs. 250/-** per each paper. The revaluation will be accepted only upto one month from the date of issue of memorandum of marks.
 - For any additional information or appropriate actions concerning Improvement, Revaluation or declaration of Results the students are requested to contact the Controller of Examinations, Kakatiya University.
- **3.10 Mal-Practice and Punishment Rules**: The following are the University Examination malpractice punishment rules:

- The candidate booked under malpractice shall not be allowed to continue further studies or repeat the course or seek admission in other *course/s* till the period of punishment is over.
- The candidates indulged in mutual consultation in examination hall shall be sent out of the examination hall by cancelling the answer script for that day only. The candidates shall, however, be permitted to appear for the rest of the examinations as per schedule.
- The candidate found guilty of malpractice during the examinations, he/she shall forego all the other examinations appeared during that period of examination. For example, if a candidate has written I & II years and caught on any day of the examination while appearing for the III year, he/she shall forego the 1,II&III years examinations as whole, which cancels all the papers which he/she had appeared earlier during that period (Annual or Supplementary) as the case may be. A candidate found guilty of malpractice in the improvement examination (after completion of course), subject to above rules of punishment, he/she will not be permitted to appear further improvement of examination.

The above rules of punishment are in addition to the following:

- When a candidate is found in possession of forbidden material, even if it is not relevant, he/she shall not be allowed to continue the remaining part of the examinations.
- If the material found is relevant, but not used, the candidate shall forego two (2) examinations i.e., the current one and the immediate subsequent examinations.
- If candidate uses the material, he/she shall forego four (4) examinations, including the

In case of (a) impersonation, (b) misbehavior with the invigilators, (c) insertion of written sheets in different hand-writings in the main answer book, (d) leaving the examination hall with the answer book: the candidate shall forego six examinations, i.e., the current one and the immediate subsequent five examinations.

4.0 Details for Obtaining the Certificate

- **4.1** Candidates after passing the complete course can obtain immediately, the provisional certificate by applying in the prescribed form together as mentioned below. This certificate will be issued and valid only till the convocation. After the convocation, degree certificate will be issued. No second or duplicate provisional certificates will be issued.
- **4.2** Candidates who have not applied to the Convocation and those who would not obtain the degree having applied for the Convocation have to receive their degree in absentia. They may therefore apply for Degree in-absentia after the Convocation in the prescribed form.

5.0 The University reserves the right to alter the course or suspend it and also the right to change the rules and regulations if found necessary. In the event of significant number of candidates do not join the particular course, the course shall not be conducted.

8.0 Admission to M.A. SANSKRIT

- 1 Must have passed B.A. examination and secured 40% marks in Sanskrit as an optional subject as main, major/one of the three equal optional subjects under Part-II (*OR*)
- 2 Must have passed B.A./B.Com./B.Sc./B.B.M./B.A. languages or its equivalent undergraduate examination and secured 50% marks in Sanskrit as Second Language in Part-1 or 50% in Sanskrit as one of the subjects of study at the concerned degree level, earning not less than 200 marks in the scheme of examination concerned (OR)
- 3 Must have passed B.A. (Language Sanskrit) examination with 40% marks in the aggregate (OR)
- 4 Must have passed B.O.I. with General English (as Part-I) of under-graduate standard with Sanskrit as a subject of study carrying not less than 200 marks in the scheme of" examination concerned (OR)
- Must have passed B.O.I. (Sanskrit) with General English of under-graduate standard of Part-1 securing 40% in the aggregate (OR)
- 6 Must have passed B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. or its equivalent examination and also passed an examination in Sanskrit which has been recognized by the Govt. of A.P. as being equivalent to an under-graduate degree thereof.
- The candidates should however have obtained 40% marks in aggregate in the said examination of Sanskrit (OR)

Must have passed M.A. in any Indian Language or M.A. (English) of a recognised University.

8.1 Admission to M.A. Hindi

The candidates seeking admission to the course must be a holder of Bachelor of Oriental Language Hindi Vidwan conducted by Hindu Prachara Sabha, Hyderabad or Praveen Examinations conducted by Dakshina Bharathi Hindi Prachara Sabha, Madras are eligible provided they pass the General English in Undergraduation Part

8.2 Admission to M.Sc. Psychology Programme

8.2.1 Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission into the First Year (Previous) M.Sc. Degree in Psychology shall be required to have passed any Degree of this University or its equivalent thereto.

A candidate seeking admission directly into the Second Year (Final) should have registered for the M.Sc. Psychology First Year examination of this University. At the time of admission into I year the following pattern of allotment of seats is observed in order to give broad representation to different types of educational backgrounds and professions.

8.2.2 Duration of the Course : 2 Years

8.2.3 Medium of Instruction

The medium of instruction and examination will be in English only.

8.2.4 Mode of Instruction

a) Study Material

The SDLCE, KU supplies study material to all the students. Study Material is in English Medium only.

b) Contact Programme Classes (Compulsory)

The SDLCE will organize useful 15 days Contact Programme by experienced faculty for both previous and final year students separately. Attendance to the Contact Programme is compulsory failing which the candidates are not allowed to write the Examinations. On extraordinary conditions, one day of absence for each Contact Programme may be allowed.

8.2.5 Examination Pattern

A candidate shall be declared to have passed the Previous Examination, if he/she obtains 40% of marks in each of the Divisions (Division 'A' means I to IV theory papers, Division 'B" means practical I & II). The same procedure shall be applicable to final examination.

The University has introduced paper-wise pass system for all the courses of Distance Education. Paper-wise pass system means, if any candidate gets fail marks / absent in a particular paper / papers, such candidate need not write all papers again. But he / she has to write only that particular paper / papers in which he / she failed for passing the degree.

8.3. Admission to Master of Communication and Journalism (MCJ) I Year Course.

- 8.3.1 Eligibility for Admission: A candidate seeking admission into MCJ course shall be required to pass Bachelor of Communication and Journalism (BCJ) course of Kakatiya University or its equivalent of any other University recognized by K.U.
- 8.3.2 **Scheme of Admission:** Admission shall be based on the merit obtained in the qualifying examination i.e. BCJ or its equivalent examination. The existing reservation rules in the University will be followed.
- 8.3.3 **MCJ 2 Year Course**: A candidate seeking admission into MCJ 2 year course shall be required to pass any Bachelor Degree .
- 8.3.4 **Medium and Mode of Instruction:** The medium of instruction and examination will be in English. The SDLCE, Kakatiya University provides study material to all the eligible students in English medium only.

The SDLCE will organize 20 contact classes in each paper with duration of 90 minutes by the experienced resource persons.

8.3.5 Examination Pattern : The existing pattern of examinations of the PG courses of KU are applicable to MCJ course also.

8.4 Admission to Master of Laws (LL.M.)

- 8.4.1 The admission to the course shall be on the basis of merit obtained in the qualifying examination (LL.B.)
- 8.4.2 The candidates seeking admission to the course must be a holder of LL.B. degree of Kakatiya University or any other university recognised by the Kakatiya University with 45 percent marks in aggregate.
- 8.4.3 The LL.M. Course is of Two years duration
- 8.4.4 The medium of instruction for the LL.M. course is ENGLISH
- 8.4.5 **Rules of promotion:** In order to be promoted to LL.M. II year, the candidate-should at least pass TWO papers of LL.M. I year
- 8.4.6 The course is organised on self-finance basis and the following is the fee structure for two years.
- 8.4.7 Course material in English in all the major areas of the subjects of LL.M. course shall be supplied to the students.
- 8.4.8 There shall be Contact-cum-Counselling classes on holidays and Sundays, subject to the condition that at least a minimum of 20 students are present. Attendance to the contact classes is not compulsory.

8.5 Admission to Certificate course in Communication Skills in English:

- Eligibility for the Course : **Intermediate or its equivalent**

- Duration of the course : 6 months

- Students intake : 100

- Attendance : **Compulsory**

- Medium of instruction : English

The course contains five papers and an examination is held in each paper at the end of the course. Each paper carries 100 marks. These marks are split into two parts: 70 marks for the theory and 30 marks for the practicals. (The internal assessment marks are based on the oral performance of the candidates).
